DECISION ON YOUR REGISTRATION UNDER REGULATION (EC) NO 1907/2006

Dear Sir/Madam,

In accordance with Article 20(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 ("the REACH Regulation"), the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) has examined the completeness of your registration dossier for **Methylcyclohexane**. This registration by **Harlan Laboratories Ltd 178** covers:

- the tonnage band **between 100 and 1000 tonnes/year**

The registration was considered complete.

This registration entitles you to manufacture/import the above-mentioned substance or, if relevant, to produce/import an article containing it, within the tonnage band(s) specified above.

If, however, you have been informed by ECHA that a previous registrant has requested an extension of your registration waiting period (in accordance with Article 27(8) of the REACH Regulation), you may start to manufacture/import the substance, or if relevant, to produce/import the article containing it, only after the expiry of 4 months from the date of notification of the present decision.

Please note that ECHA always informs registrants that:

- In accordance with Article 20(2) of the REACH Regulation, the completeness check ascertains that all the elements required have been provided and the fee payment has been made. However, this completeness check does not include an assessment of the quality or the adequacy of any data or justifications submitted. Such an assessment may occur later in a compliance check.
- In accordance with Article 22(1) of the REACH Regulation, registrants are on their own initiative required to update their registrations without undue delay with relevant new information and submit them to ECHA in the cases described in this provision (for instance, change in status, substance composition or quantities).
- Articles 11(1) and 19(1) of the REACH Regulation oblige registrants of the same substance to submit certain information jointly. This obligation applies to you and any other existing or future registrant of the same substance.

Note that, if your IUCLID dossier did not include an EC number in section 1.1, REACH-IT has automatically generated one because substances in dossier updates always have to be identified with the relevant EC number. In this case, before proceeding with an update dossier you have to export from REACH-IT the EC entry that has been created and import it into your IUCLID installation inventory. Failure to do so will result in your dossier being automatically rejected by the system.
